TRAINING WORKSHOPS

Introduction to CALEA® and CALEA Accreditation Programs

This workshop will cover the history and structure of CALEA, as well as a description of CALEA's Accreditation Programs: *Law Enforcement*, *Public Safety Communications*, and *Public Safety Training Academy*.

New Accreditation Manager Training

This workshop is designed for the newly assigned accreditation manager and includes a discussion of the role and responsibilities of the accreditation manager for any of CALEA's Programs. Gain an understanding of CALEA's 5-step accreditation process and receive an introduction to the CALEA Accreditation Compliance Express (CACE) software program.

Reaccreditation Management

This workshop is designed for both the newly assigned accreditation manager and the experienced accreditation manager from an agency that has already achieved at least one award.

Preparing for an On-site

This workshop will discuss the duties and responsibilities of the accreditation manager with a focus on CALEA's process and requirements for an on-site assessment.

CACE Laboratory

This workshop provides hands-on instruction to the primary users of the CALEA Accreditation Compliance Express (CACE-L, CACE-C, CACE-T, or CACE-R) Programs. Topics covered will include program navigation, hyperlink set-up, reports building, developing task reminders, and performing system utilities. **Advanced registration is required and enrollment is on a first come/first serve basis. Generational Management

This workshop will describe challenges faced by law enforcement supervisors who manage units with large generational spans. Included in the discussion are the importance of recognizing the difference in generations and how to effectively communicate with each and develop a strong, successful working relationship.

Fusion Center Unit

The Fusion Center Unit acts as an information resource and research center that provides accurate and quick information during various types of investigations. This workshop will provide practical information, insights, and successes.

Actividades con la Comunidad – Programa

Respuesta a la Escena del Crimen

Esta sesión presenta el conocimiento a fondo del éxito de la Unidad para Respuesta a la Escena del Crimen de la Policía de Dallas, y le da énfasis a la capacitación y recolección metodológica de la evidencia.

Human Trafficking

This workshop will provide insight on the trends of Human Trafficking Crimes along with an overview of how local law enforcement can identify and address this growing crime trend.

Data-Driven Approaches to Crime and Traffic Safety (DDACTS): Deploying Your Resources Effectively to Improve Public Safety

This workshop will include a discussion of the DDACTS concept, how it can be implemented, and results from several agencies that are using the model. Specific information regarding the use of the DDACTS model to support CALEA Standards will be included.

Leadership Training

This workshop will provide insight in why law enforcement agencies are turning away from a strictly “Warrior/Soldier Mentality” when training their officers. Many agencies are infiltrating their training with Leadership courses and are focused in creating a more polished Professional Officer.

Caminos, Riesgo y Responsabilidad

En esta clase se analizan los riesgos asociados con la operación de vehículos de motor, las responsabilidades de los oficiales, y las expectativas del departamento y de la comunidad.

Mid-Level Drug and Narcotics Investigations “Going Beyond the Street Level Dealer”

This workshop will focus on the mid-level narcotic dealers who are often overlooked by law enforcement agencies. Local agencies attack street-level dealers, while federal agencies target upper-level drug organizations.

The Prison Rape Elimination Act of 2003 (PREA): An Update — What Law Enforcement Needs to Know

This workshop will provide an overview of PREA, the standards, and what’s next. The standards promulgated by the National Prison Rape Elimination Commission are applicable to law enforcement organizations that operate short-term holding areas, court holding areas, and arrestee lock-ups. So what do law enforcement executives need to know, and what assessments should they be undertaking?

Ethical Approach to Law Enforcement

This workshop will demonstrate how ethics and integrity are an ongoing factor in law enforcement and must be a continuing discussion and training topic.

Eyewitness Identification Reform - Blind Sequential Lineups

This workshop will address recent court exonerations in Dallas County, the lessons learned, new training implemented, including the practice of Blind Sequential Lineups.

Investigative/System Response to High Risk Victims/Domestic Trafficking of Children: Dallas Model

This is a 2 part workshop that will discuss the development of a High Profile Victim’s Program that combats the sexual abuse and exploitation of children. Addressed is how to develop a plan that will aid investigators in their decision making related to such high profile incidents.

Pandillas

Los asistentes aprenderán a identificar e interpretar las señales de alerta de tráfico de personas tanto como los comportamientos usuales de la víctima y el traficante.
