TRAINING WORKSHOPS

Introduction to CALEA® and CALEA Accreditation Programs

This workshop will cover the history and structure of CALEA, as well as a description of CALEA's Accreditation Programs: *Law Enforcement, Public Safety Communications, and Public Safety Training Academy.*

New Accreditation Manager Training

This workshop is designed for the newly assigned accreditation manager and includes a discussion of the role and responsibilities of the accreditation manager for any of CALEA's Programs. Gain an understanding of CALEA's 5-step accreditation process and receive an introduction to the CALEA Accreditation Compliance Express (CACE) software program.

Reaccreditation Management

This workshop is designed for both the newly assigned accreditation manager and the experienced accreditation manager from an agency that has already achieved at least one award.

Preparing for an On-site

This workshop will discuss the duties and responsibilities of the accreditation manager with a focus on CALEA's process and requirements for an on-site assessment.

CACE Laboratory

This workshop provides hands-on instruction to the primary users of the CALEA Accreditation Compliance Express (CACE-L, CACE-C, CACE-T, or CACE-R) Programs. Topics covered will include program navigation, hyperlink set-up, reports building, developing task reminders, and performing system utilities. **Advanced registration is required and enrollment is on a first come/first serve basis. Mock Assessment Training

This workshop is designed for agencies considering a mock assessment, accreditation managers, and mock assessors. It will help to explain the principles of a successful mock assessment, the responsibilities of parties involved, and establish a performance base line for mock assessments.

Creating Defensible Personnel Practices

This workshop will address recent court decisions regarding personnel practices in public safety. Discussed are the importance of conducting a thorough job task analysis, development of valid job descriptions, performance evaluations, compensation plans, training curricula and selection/promotion tests.

The Billboard Emergency Alert System (The B.E.A.S. Project)

The Billboard Emergency Alert System (The B.E.A.S. Project) provides life saving information notifications by utilizing reverse notification and local electronic billboards for public emergency alert notifications to the traveling public. Learn how this program can be easily reproduced.

Lessons Learned from Virginia Tech Shootings

This workshop will provide an overview presentation of the Virginia Tech Shootings and the lessons learned.

APCO RETAINS Project

This workshop will provide an overview of how the project RETAINS covers the high turnover rate of telecommunicators and presents strategies related to retention and job satisfaction.

“Who’s Watching? - The Importance of Character and Integrity”

This workshop will demonstrate how to return true character and integrity to the forefront. Compromises in character and integrity should not be expected and accepted as common-place.

Reintegration of Military Reservists Back into the Workforce

This workshop describes the challenges faced by the public safety department in the reintegration of military reservists and focuses on training and comprehensive needs of the employee.

The Prison Rape Elimination Act of 2003 (PREA):

What Law Enforcement Needs to Know

This workshop will provide an overview of PREA, the standards, and what’s next. The Prison Rape Elimination Act of 2003 (PREA) establishes national standards applicable to all law enforcement and corrections agencies that have custodial facilities or short-term holding areas, regardless of the size of the facility/area, or the length of arrestees’ stays.

APCO – The Call-Takers Role in Missing and Exploited Children

This workshop will provide information for handling Missing and Exploited Children calls as well as tips for gathering information to aid in the recovery of the child and arrest of the suspect.

LInX Law Enforcement Information Exchange

The LInX database is used by agencies across the region and has helped in the identification of numerous suspects, victims, and persons of interest. LInX allows Investigators from all across the region to link information from incident to incident, person to person and/or address to address.

25 Things an Employer Can do to Protect Themselves from Claims of Discrimination

This workshop will provide insight to improve employer/employee relations and how to guard against claims of discrimination.

The Washington State Child Homicide Study: Who is Killing our Children?

In this workshop offender and victim profiles of the Washington State Child Homicide Study provide information that will aid investigators in their decision making related to a child abduction murder.

Telecommunicator Emergency Response Taskforce (TERT)

This class will give an overview of a national program geared toward the development of trained teams of telecommunicators who can be mobilized and respond to areas to provide assistance under emergency circumstances.

LifeNet Health - Saving Lives, Restoring Health

This workshop will discuss the importance law enforcement plays in identifying organ and tissue donors. Also highlighted are the legal, moral and ethical responsibilities of law enforcement and health care providers.
